

Academic Performance Data


Impact scholars made significant gains in reading and math according to the national norm-referenced NWEA MAP Assessment. In both reading and math, Impact scholars went from below the national norm at the beginning of the year to well above the national norm at the end of the year.

NWEA MAP Assessment: Baseline to End of Year




Impact scholars also met their NWEA MAP growth targets at high levels. 77% of scholars met their reading growth targets and 87% of scholars met their math growth targets. Students of color and low-income students also met their growth targets at high rates, as shown below. Additionally, 81% of English Learners met their growth targets in reading and 91% of English Learners met their growth targets in math.

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Summary of Community Feedback

- 98% of families would recommend Impact Public Schools to another family.
- 98% of families think that communication with the school happens in a respectful manner.

Every scholar participates in a small, targeted reading and math group each day, ensuring everyone grows!

Learning Improvement Plans


Students who are significantly below grade level in reading, writing, or math are identified every 6 weeks and receive intensive small group support and weekly progress monitoring in addition to grade level instruction.

Invitation to All Parents & Citizens to Participate in School Activities

Throughout the year, we gather feedback from our stakeholders via surveys, Village Action Committee meetings, Principal Coffee Talks, conferences, and informal conversations. Through these channels, we learned that we needed to streamline communications and offer easier access to translated materials. We also found that areas for improvement included meals, arrival, and dismissal. For these reasons, we have implemented new communication systems that translate communications into multiple languages, and new procedures for meals, arrival and dismissal.
